## Hey, Ridgecresters!

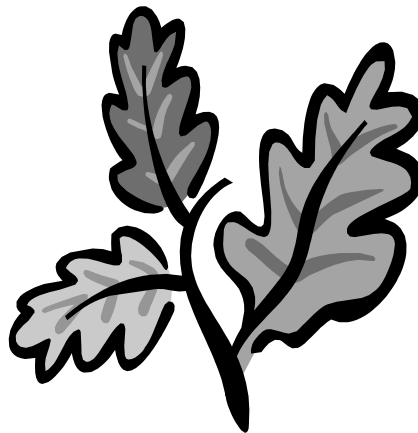

## From the Prayer Room
